On January 12 the SSM faith community took part in the baptism of Harrison Richard Chybowski. In holy baptism we are named a beloved child of God and nothing can change that. Over a lifetime our vocation may change, but nothing can

change the fact that each of us is beloved.

Lutherans love to talk about vocation. The decision to be a teacher, a salesperson, a parent, or computer programmer is certainly one large vocational question most of us face at some point in our lives.

Yet our baptismal vocation is much more than our career—though it certainly includes that. We can get stuck when we think that we have one calling for our whole lives. But perhaps our vocation—or call is—to become the unique person that God has created us to be—at each stage of our lives. The call of an infant differs from that of an adolescent, a college student, a parent with a newborn, a person in retirement, or someone living with Alzheimer's.

We learn one from another by telling our life stories. We learn about ourselves and our unique vocation by listening to the ponderings of our hearts. In other words, we are not called to live someone's else's life—only our own.

Our lives continue to change over time and so do our callings. SSM continues to be a community where we can reflect on our baptismal vocation, tell our stories, and encourage one another to be faithful in whatever unfolds for us, for our loved ones, for our communities, and for the world.



## Loose Ends Lunch




The February Loose Ends Lunch will be held on February 12th at noon at Benny's Café. Benny's is located at 5354 S 28th Street.

#### I Love to tell the Story; will be my theme in Glory; To Tell the old old story of Jesus and his love.



We've already begun with the Advent remembrance of God's promises to the prophets and to Mary. 

# Council Minutes - Dec. 10

Present: Denise Sanders, Lorin Schuchardt, John Muroni, Sandy Wesolowski, Kristy Knipple, Kipp Zimmermann, Eric Sanders, Jane Miller, Keri Whitmore, Pastor Brian Hooper, Shelly Rosenstock, Alex Dollar, Carol Jackett The meeting was called to order by Denise Sanders at 6:35 pm. Alex shared a devotion

**November Meeting Minutes Review** The November Meeting minutes were reviewed and approved as amended.

Financial Reports The monthly Financial Reports were presented and approved. Jane reported that as of November we are still under budget by \$5,000. That should improve with December donations and year end special donations. John Muroni reported that there were no unusual or unexpected expenses in November. We continue to have sufficient funds to cover anticipated expenses. This month we began receiving our annual increased cell tower land lease payment. Our Old National CD will be maturing in December. The CD included Mission Endowment Fund and money for future operating expenses.

Pastor Brian's Report The Christmas Caroling at Harbor Village was done on Dec. 5th and was well received. New members Mara Dean, Pam Lange, Richard and Beverly Weeden were welcomed on December 8<sup>th</sup>. Attended Greater Milwaukee Conference gathering on November 11<sup>th</sup>. Attended Clergy of Greens meeting that discussed having a prayer service for Peace and Unity on Sunday, 1/19. Saint Stephen the Martyr was offered as a host. Good ideas were generated at "Leading Well Storytelling" event. Thought is to create a storytelling event on wilderness stories. A 60-year celebration idea - Have people respond to "SSM matters to me because....". This could be 2 – 3 minutes for temple talks, newsletter or Lent series. Congregation members could be interviewed and highlight their story in church publications.

#### **Current Action Items:**

Building Status Update: Jim Hennessy (Maintenance) attended the meeting to discuss issues. Generally, the building is in good shape. But there are some concerns that need to be addressed. Boilers - There are 3 boilers but one is in bad shape and needs to eventually be replaced. The other two are good for now. The quote for replacing the one boiler is \$15,000. The consensus of the Council is we should look at replacing the one boiler soon. Retaining Wall - The retaining wall by the back door leading to the Prayer Garden is buckling and needs to be replaced or torn down. After looking at the wall the Council agreed it needs to be addressed. The water fountain downstairs is not needed and will be turned off.

# **Council Minutes Continued**

<u>Sabbatical Policy Reviewed</u>: The last two sections of the Sabbatical Leave Policy on "Church Council Responsibilities" and "Pastoral Covenant" were reviewed. After minor changes to those sections and formatting the policy is ready to be presented to the congregation at the January Congregation Meeting.

**Annual Congregation Meeting:** 

<u>Agenda - Sunday, January 26,</u> 2025 Regular agenda items. Treasurer Election. Sabbatical Leave Policy. Budget 2025. Reconciling in Christ.

<u>Budget Discussion</u>: Eric presented budget information for 2024 and projections for 2025. During the next Council Meeting on January 7<sup>th</sup> final numbers for 2024 and projections for 2025 will be available for review.

By the next Council Meeting Jan. 7<sup>th</sup> Committee Chairpersons should have as firm a number as possible for their 2025 needs.

#### **Committee Reports:**

<u>Music and Worship</u> – preparing for the Christmas season activities

<u>Christian Education</u> – Sunday School children are preparing for the concert during the Christmas service on Sunday, Dec 22.

<u>Evangelism</u> – continuing to look at mailers and other ways to promote SSM.

<u>Stewardship</u> –still compiling all the pledge cards for 2025. Overall pledges appear to be up now with more to be added.

<u>Fellowship</u> – Continuing to do the usual activities – coffee hour, etc. Planning events for 2025 including a rummage sale.

<u>Finance</u> – Reviewing the 2024 year-end numbers and planning for the 2025 budgets.

<u>Youth and Family</u> – Pajama Party planned for Dec. 15, 2024, with pizza and a movie.

<u>Human Concerns</u> – Needs in the community remain great especially for food pantries. Sunday school kids worked on gift card by adding notes.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer Pastor Brian led in a clos-

ing prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 8:00
